The opportunity

The Black Country Federation is seeking an excellent and enthusiastic teacher with a specialism in SEND. The initial deployment is expected to be predominantly within our SETT provision at Brockmoor Primary School, working with pupils with complex and additional needs. As provision develops, the role may be deployed differently across the federation according to pupil need and school priorities.

The successful candidate will initially work with some of our most vulnerable pupils, leading high-quality teaching within SETT and helping us continue to shape ambitious SEND provision. We want someone who is energised by curriculum design, precise assessment and finding the right route into learning for individual pupils, with the flexibility to use that expertise wherever it can have greatest impact across BCF.

Initial focus: SETT at Brockmoor

SETT is specialist SEND provision at Brockmoor Primary School. It is not somewhere pupils are placed because their behaviour is difficult, nor is it an alternative to belonging to their school community.

Our ambition is that pupils experience a purposeful, carefully sequenced curriculum built from their individual starting points, while accessing learning, experiences and relationships across the wider school wherever this is appropriate and meaningful. Inclusion is not simply being in the same room; it is receiving the teaching needed to learn, participate and thrive.

Key responsibilities

- Take responsibility for planning and teaching an ambitious, appropriately adapted curriculum for pupils with SEND, initially predominantly within SETT.
- Use assessment intelligently to establish pupils' starting points, identify next steps and adapt teaching.

- Plan learning that develops knowledge, communication, independence, engagement and wider development.
- Maintain high expectations while making learning accessible and meaningful for individual pupils.
- Lead the day-to-day teaching practice of adults working alongside the pupils for whom the post holder has responsibility, ensuring support promotes learning and independence.
- Work closely with the SENDCO, senior leaders, class teachers, families and external professionals.
- Plan purposeful opportunities for pupils to access learning and experiences across their wider school community.
- Contribute to, and where appropriate help shape, SEND curriculum, pedagogy and provision across BCF.
- Evaluate whether provision is making a difference and adjust curriculum and teaching in response to evidence.
- Safeguard pupils rigorously and champion their entitlement to an excellent education.

Person specification - we are looking for a teacher who

- Holds Qualified Teacher Status and demonstrates strong classroom practice.
- Is genuinely passionate about teaching pupils with SEND and working with vulnerable learners.
- Has strong curriculum and pedagogical knowledge and can translate this into highly responsive teaching.
- Can plan from individual starting points without lowering ambition.
- Understands the importance of communication, regulation, independence and personal development.
- Uses assessment to inform teaching rather than simply record progress.
- Can lead and develop the practice of teaching assistants and other adults.
- Builds strong professional relationships with families and external professionals.
- Is reflective, collaborative and excited by the opportunity to shape developing specialist provision.

Desirable experience

- Experience of teaching pupils with SEND and/or within specialist provision.
- Knowledge of effective approaches for pupils with communication, cognition and learning, sensory or social-emotional needs.
- Experience of contributing to curriculum development or leading adults.
- Relevant SEND professional development or qualifications.
